UPTOWN NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT RE-ELECTED!

Paul Oberg came to Wichita from Minnesota in 1983 after spending three years in Central America (El Salvador & Costa Rica) as a Peace Corps Volunteer. He received his B.A. in Anthropology from the University of Minnesota and M.A. in Anthropology with a Specialization in Museology from the University of Washington, in Seattle. Ever since high school, Paul has worked continuously for one museum or another beginning with the **Science Museum of Minnesota**; the **Burke Museum** in Washington; the **San Juan Island Historical Museum** at Friday Harbor in Puget Sound; the **Museo Nacional de Historia Natural** in the capital city of San Salvador, El Salvador; the **Museo Nacional de Costa Rica** in the capital city of San José; the McCormick School Museum here in Wichita; and the **Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands Museum of History and Culture** on Saipan—one of a long chain of islands north of Guam in the West Pacific.

For a period of 15 years, until the program was cut from the Wichita Public Schools budget, Paul was employed as Supervisor of Museum Programs in charge of the **McCormick School Museum** (some of you might recall a visit to your child's school by the Mobile Trading Post Museum in years past). You can still find him once or twice a week at McCormick—an 1890s National Registry site off South Seneca—where more than a century of USD 259 institutional history is kept by volunteers from the Wichita Association of Retired School Personnel.

Paul is surviving as a substitute teacher and lives with his wife, Nancy (formerly of Valley Center, and a member of the dance troupe, *The Delano Dollies*) along with three cats in a 1925 bungalow at 339 N. Chautauqua. He's in the phone book and you are welcome to call anytime. Better yet, come to the next Uptown Neighborhood Association meeting and meet him in person!

Pet Considerations for Winter

During the winter months you need to take time to ensure that your pets enjoy a happy, healthy winter season.


Housing: It is best to keep pets indoors during the winter months, but if this is not possible, outdoor pets must be provided with shelter. Their home should be elevated off the ground to prevent moisture accumulation and have a door of some kind to keep out winter winds, sleet, and snow. Shelters should be insulated or heated. Water sources may be heated to permit constant access to unfrozen water; thermal units designed 2006 specifically for this purpose are readily available. Outdoor pets require extra calories to keep warm feed your pet according to its needs when the temperature drops. In severely cold or inclement weather, no pet should be kept outside. Indoor pets should have sleeping quarters in a draft-free, warm area with their bed or mattress elevated slightly off the floor.

Roaming cats, as well as house pets and wildlife, may climb onto vehicle engines for warmth during cold weather. Be sure to check under the hood before starting your vehicle and honk the horn to startle any animals seeking shelter inside.
