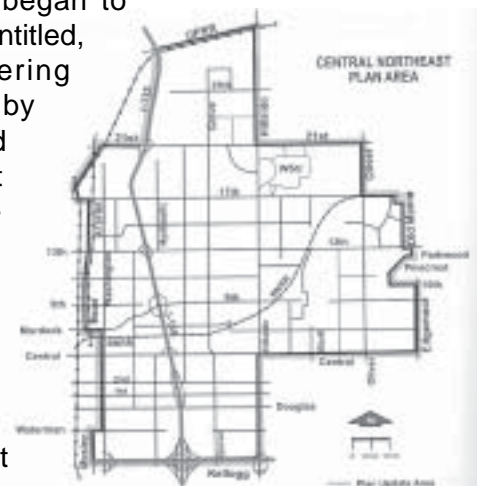

## Central Northeast Area Plan Council Established

Over a year ago, with the active support of the Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Department (MAPD), community members of N.E. Wichita began to update the 1995 area revitalization plan entitled, "Wichita's Northeast: Rediscovering Community." After a dozen meetings by representatives from twelve neighborhood associations, two housing development organizations and multiple area non-profits, the Central Northeast Area Plan Update, was published late last year and officially adopted as an amendment to the Wichita-Sedgwick County Comprehensive Plan on September 22, 2005 (Ordinance No. 46-657).

Just last month, the Central Northeast Area Council of Neighborhood Associations was established to ensure that every effort is made by the community to follow through with the recommendations outlined by the Update. Neighborhood associations within the designated boundaries—all from Wichita City District 1 (see illustration)—are active members. Association presidents, or their designees, now attend. Meetings are open to the public and held at 6:30pm on the first Thursday of every month at Atwater Neighborhood City Hall, 2755 E. 19th St. Unfortunately this time frame is in direct conflict with our Uptown meetings so Paul Oberg has asked Mike Barushok to attend whenever possible. Committees are presently working on a mission statement, by-laws and a short-range plan of action.

Despite the fact that no funds have been earmarked for this task, great things could come of these efforts. The sense of grass-roots ownership in the proceedings to date, adeptly augmented by MAPD staff and administration, may prevail with perseverance and time. At the very least, communication among neighborhood associations in the area should improve; which is a significant step in the right direction.

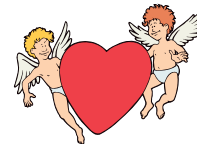
## BB & Pellet Guns, CPOs, Air Rifles

## **\*\*Outstanding Warrant? City Wants to Make a Deal**

People with outstanding warrants from the city of Wichita will have a chance in February to get them resolved without facing certain fees or, in some cases, jail time.

The Wichita City Council on Tuesday approved an amnesty program for the week of Feb 13-17.

The program waives the typical \$15 to \$25 warrant fee for participants. People with outstanding traffic warrants who voluntarily appear to pay their debts will not be arrested that week.

A judge will be available to hear cases where a bench warrant or a probation violation warrant was issued, according to city documents.

Payment plans will be arranged for people unable to pay their obligations in a lump sum, according to Kay Gales, municipal court administrator.

"This is a good-faith effort on our part to try and reduce the number of people who are incarcerated," said city councilman Carl Brewer.

About 3,000 people are expected to participate. Program coordinators anticipate more than \$60,000 will be collected.

During a similar amnesty program in 2003, the city collected \$116,000 in fines and late fees from 2,113 Wichitans.

Currently, city documents report about 14,860 outstanding parking, traffic, health department, fire department and Office of Central Inspection warrants and about 28,080 bench and probation violation warrants.

## Motorized Scooters

As warm weather approaches, we will see a significant increase in juveniles riding motorized scooters and skateboards on public streets. We are also noticing many of them out after Christmas this year. This is a very dangerous activity since the majority of operators do not use safety equipment and the machines are not equipped with the correct safety lighting.

Motorized scooters and skateboards fall within the City and State definition of a motor vehicle. As per State Statute 8-142, 8-235 and City Ordinance 11.04.170 which state: **"Motor vehicle" means every vehicle which is self-propelled**

These scooters, skateboards, go-carts and go-peds fall within the definition of a motor vehicle and therefore require safety equipment, lights, blinkers, appropriate braking systems and reflectors, as well as being tagged and registered if operated on a public street or public right-of-way. The driver must also have in their possession a **valid driver's license**. If you are under the age of 14, it is **ILLEGAL** for you to drive one.

Every Spring and Summer, the Police Department receives numerous neighborhood complaints regarding these vehicles. Appropriate rules and regulations can be enforced since motorized scooters and skateboards are considered motor vehicles. Therefore, if a person age 14 or older is stopped for this violation, he or she can be issued a citation. If a person is under the age of 14, the parent or guardian is responsible and could be issued a citation for allowing an unlicensed person to operate a vehicle.

**These vehicles can be operated on private property with the owner's permission.** We see careless and reckless behavior in the operation of these vehicles on both public and private property. These vehicles are much less visible than a motorcycle on a street and could result in very serious injuries if involved in a crash.

Parents need to realize that when they purchase any motorized vehicle, there are requirements and liabilities associated with their use. They need to be cognizant of the dangers because they are not toys.

## Fire Destroys Twigs, But Owner Vows to Rebuild

An overnight fire has destroyed Twigs, a store featuring flowers, gifts and decorative accessories at 2601 E. Douglas.

Wichita Fire Department Capt. Brad Crisp said the fire call came in at about 2:50 a.m., and the fire was so intense so quickly that firefighters had to shift into a defensive posture in an attempt to save Moler's Camera next door.

Firefighters were pouring water onto smoking remnants this morning while Twigs owner Iven Kelley and many of the store's employees huddled together on the sidewalk across the street.

"It's not fair," Kelley said, clinging to a warm beverage in a Panera's cup, as he looked at what was left of the business he opened in 1997.

He went over to give an employee a hug, while others dabbed their eyes. Kelley said he will rebuild at the location, and until then will work out of his warehouse two blocks away. Customers who had been working with the store to handle weddings or other special events should call him on his cell phone at (316) 993-3208, Kelley said.

It's too early to determine how the fire started or how much damage it caused, Crisp said. Moler's did receive some slight water and smoke damage, he said, but the fire wall between the businesses in the old brick buildings "held up pretty well" and permitted firefighters to limit the damage.

## Fire at Twigs Called Arson

It was no accident.

The Wednesday morning fire that destroyed Twigs, a decorating and flower store at 2601 E. Douglas, has been classified as an arson, Wichita Fire Marshal Ed Bricknell announced Friday.

An investigation of the fire scene and interviews with witnesses have eliminated "any and all accidental causes," Bricknell said.

Authorities have identified a "person of interest" but no suspects, he said. An arrest is not imminent. "We don't want to leave the false impression about anybody — the owner of the property, or even the person of interest," Bricknell said. "We could be barking up the wrong tree." At the same time, he said, authorities haven't ruled anyone out.

"The investigation is ongoing," Bricknell said.

"We're still talking to people and gathering information." Investigators have already talked to Twigs owner Iven Kelley and "everyone that has any interest" in the old brick building that housed Twigs, Bricknell said. That includes the man who was remodeling space in the back of the building into a hair salon. In a statement released Friday, Kelley, who is vacationing in Mexico, said news that the fire was classified as an arson "makes this loss even more painful."

"Twigs is my life," Kelley said. "I love Wichita, my employees, and especially my customers. I will be back in business." He said investigators told him "there was no reason to cancel our trip," which had been planned for months. He said he and his staff had been and would continue to be cooperative.

"We're not concerned about him being gone," Bricknell said of Kelley, whose home and business have burned this month. "We don't get the impression whatsoever that he's fleeing anything."

Kelley's home at 7 N. Crestview Lakes — near 21st and Oliver — was heavily damaged by fire on Dec. 15, but Bricknell said it's "a good possibility" that the two fires are nothing more than a coincidence. Wednesday's fire caused about \$590,000 in damage to the building and contents of Twigs. Authorities are still hoping to hear from anyone who shot video of the early stages of the fire, Bricknell said.

They are being asked to call the Fire Department's investigations section at 268-4585.

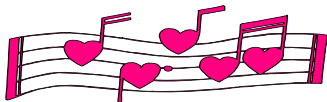
**\*\*Weapon Drop Off**

## Household Hazardous Waste Facility

Before the neighborhood clean-up on April 29th, ask yourself these questions:

Do you change the oil in your vehicles?

Do you have antifreeze or old gasoline you need to get rid of? Are vehicle batteries cluttering up your property? What about paints, solvents and other types of leftover items?

If you have any of these items, you can take them to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility for free and they will be disposed of properly. It is located at 801 Stillwell (5 blocks south of Kellogg and 2 blocks east of Seneca). They are open from 9-5:30 Tuesday—Friday and from 9-3 on Saturday.

While you are there, take a look at the Swap and Shop area. You might find items there that you can take home with you—also for free, things like paint, cleaners, waxes, etc.

Remember, we cannot pick up hazardous waste materials during the neighborhood clean-up on April 29th, so take them to the Waste Facility off south Seneca.
